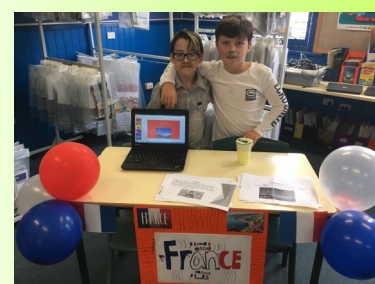


# TRAVEL EXPO

## School Cross Country—Thursday 11th April

Our Cross Country Carnival will be held at school this Thursday 11<sup>th</sup> April for all students from Kindergarten to Year 6. Students will begin races at 9.10am and the distance they will complete will depend on the age they are turning this year. We welcome all families to come and support the students during their races. Students that are turning 8 or above this year will be competing for the opportunity to represent our school at the Zone Cross Country Carnival on Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> May at Cessnock Racecourse. The length of the course students will be running will be approx 400m, the total distances and numbers of laps for students to complete are:

K-2 students – 1km (not including those students turning 8 this year)

8/9yrs girls & boys – 2km

10yrs girls & boys – 2km

11yrs girls & boys – 3km

12/13yrs girls & boys – 3km
