K-1,2 Well done to the students in K-1,2 for their great effort at the sports carnival on Friday. It was good to see our students participating in all the events, enjoying the activities and showing great sportsmanship. A big thank you to our parent helpers, for helping with the marshalling.

K-1,2 will be presenting their speeches to the class this week. I am looking forward to listening to all the wonderful speeches about objects that are important to them. As the term progresses, the students are continuing to explore the unit of work on Identity. This learning has been integrated into Art, where the students have been developing an understanding of their uniqueness and individuality in the making of their artworks. We have been looking at different artists and their creations, in particular the portraits of people and the different techniques and colours used to express their opinions and ideas in artworks. The students are also creating their own portraits using a variety of techniques, media and tools.

Year 5-6 In numeracy Stage 3 has been learning to identify, continue, create and describe a range of geometric and number patterns as well as exploring how to locate and record the coordinates of points in all four quadrants of the Cartesian plane.

We have also been learning that to grow as a person, sometimes you need to go outside your comfort zone and we have been exploring and considering how you can prepare and plan before taking these responsible risks.

Part of their learning journey as leaders within Mulbring PS, Stage 3 students were presented with the chance to attend a Young Leaders Day Conference at Civic Theatre in Newcastle. The students enjoyed an inspiring day of interactive activities, discussions, leadership games and entertainment with the main focus on how they can develop as a leader and make a difference within our school. It was fantastic to see all students relish and appreciate this opportunity in which they got to interact and share experiences with leaders from many other local schools.
