## HUNTER MOBILE PRESCHOOL

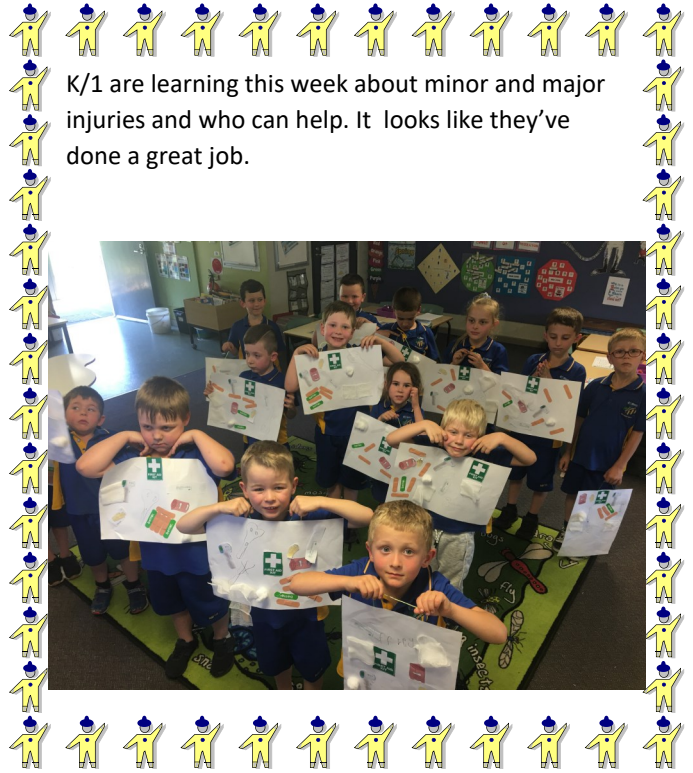

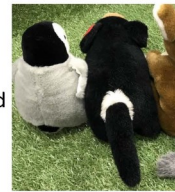


### Whose Bum Is That? – Wednesday October 7<sup>th</sup>, Ages 6+, Cost \$5.00
